08 April 2025

224. County Councillor

County Councillor Haworth-Culf submitted apologies; a report had been previously circulated.

225. District Councillor

District Councillor Daly was in attendance. A parish report and energy report had been previously circulated. Councillor Daly reported that the Holidays Activity Fund (HAF) funded by the UK Government is running over the Easter Holidays in Suffolk. The programme is targeted at those eligible for benefits-related to free school meals and other vulnerable children link to book:

Leaders of the five district councils have submitted their interim plan for Suffolk Local Government Reorganisation <https://www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/assets/Your-Council/LGR/Suffolk-LGR-interim-plan.pdf>. A group of key farming and stakeholders met with East Suffolk Council to discuss shared ambitions for producers and consumers, as they work together for a sustainable farming future. East Suffolk Council Nature at Work scheme <https://tinyurl.com/5d63wvy9>, supporting nature in over 116 wild spaces across East Suffolk. With reference to Ease the Squeeze and Cost of Living all information has been collated into one easy to use site www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/community/squeeze/.

Councillor Crisp questioned Sizewell c Project monies for Leiston. The Clerk confirmed this is being followed up by the Place Board and that there are no ringfenced monies for Leiston. It is detailed in the Deed of Obligation which will be circulated. Councillor Corbett confirmed that was her understanding too.

A member of the public raised concerns about damage to farmland, nature and trees, particularly questioning the removal of hedgerows during nesting season. Councillor Daly offered reassurance that East Suffolk Council monitors such activity and raises queries when necessary. He encouraged anyone with concerns about potentially inappropriate works to contact him directly. He also explained that vegetation can be removed during nesting season, provided the Ecology Clerk of Works has confirmed that no birds are nesting on the site.

A member of the public echoed the same concern about hedgerows citing Buckleswood Road noting the importance of these hedgerows to wildlife corridors. He informed Council that Wild Aldhurst is part of the statutory replacement for Fen Meadow and queried the claims that the site is near to meeting the criteria for SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest). He also asked that Council note the need for the Suffolk County Council VECTOS Sizewell B Emergency Evacuation Plan to be revised considering Sizewell C and increased housing in the town.

A member of the public drew attention to recent media coverage on the rising cost of house rentals in the local area, questioning why East Suffolk Council seems to be moving away from the Community Land Trust Market Plan Proposal, which includes provisions for affordable housing. Councillor Daly reassured that East Suffolk Council is committed to affordable housing, but various constraints make it difficult to achieve and there is ongoing dialogue about Market Square with the place Board.

It was proposed by Councillor Corbett, seconded by Councillor Last that the time being 7.30pm, Standing Orders be suspended to allow this part of the public meeting to be completed.

Councillor Crisp questioned the watering of the newly replanted trees at the rear of Carr Avenue. Councillor Daly confirmed he would follow up on the matter.

226. Public Forum

Mr Rainger provided councillors with an update on the refurbishment works at the Long Shop Museum, confirming that the project is on schedule for reopening on Steam Up Day, 4 May 2025. Councillors are warmly invited to attend the event.

A member of the public inquired about improvements to the council's website. The Clerk confirmed that work on a new and improved Town Council website is underway, with plans to launch it soon.

227. Apologies

Apologies were received from Councillor Levermore, Councillor Morsley, Councillor Cooper, Councillor Dix and Councillor Boast.

228. Councillor Resignation and Vacancy

The Mayor confirmed Councillor Wray's resignation and confirmed an official vacancy notice has been posted with a closing date of 06 May 2025.

229. Declarations of Interest

Councillor Last for Leiston Place Board, Councillor Hawkins for Grant Applications, Councillor Corbett for Leiston Place Board, Councillor Geater for Personnel and Councillor Crisp for Community Land Trust.

230. Minutes of the Meeting held 11 March 2025

With an amendment to remove Councillor Levermore from the present list it was proposed by Councillor Last, seconded by Councillor Motion and agreed the minutes for the meeting held 11 March 2025 be signed as a true record.

231 Mayor's Communications

The Mayor commented thus:

The Deputy Mayor and I accepted an invitation to attend the launch of SZC's first hydrogen buses held at Trinity Park on 20th March as part of SZC's hydrogen bus pilot scheme. We travelled in a hydrogen bus from the ACA together with members of the Student Council of Alde Valley Academy. Wrightbus, creators of the world's first hydrogen double-decker bus and Ryze Power, suppliers of the green hydrogen fuelling this trial were at the launch.

On Wednesday 26th March I served on the Galloper Wind Farm Funding Panel and I'm pleased to report that we were able to award funds to support six grant applications.

Together with Councillor Cooper I attended a demonstration evening at 1379 (Leiston) Sqn HQ on 2nd April. The Squadron has 31 cadets and there were a number of activities taking place both indoors and outdoors. I was very impressed with the confidence the cadets exhibited when explaining the many tasks being undertaken and how they enjoyed the various experiences on offer as a Leiston Air Cadet.

There will be a Leiston Community Energy Advice Drop-in this Thursday 10th April 1.30 – 5.30 p.m. at The Waterloo Centre. I have been invited to open the event which Net Zero Leiston, the Suffolk Climate Action Team and Leiston Town Council are supporting. This is an opportunity for the community to seek free advice on how to reduce energy use, manage bills, stay warm and to find out what help is available.

Finally, I would like to remind you of the VE Day event planned for 8th May at Sizewell Beach from 6.00 to 8.30 p.m. The lighting of the beacon will take place at 8.30 weather permitting.

232. Assets Steering Groups

a) Live Well Hub Notes of Meeting held 01 April 2025

Councillors noted the previously circulated report. A meeting was held with Sizewell C Project, Suffolk New College and members of the Live Well Hub steering group including the Mayor to discuss how the Waterloo Centre might Combine Live Well Services with post-16 education provision. In principle agreement was reached that education provision could complement Live Well services. A further meeting is being convened to look at the practicalities and repurposing of the building that may be required.

b) Leiston Film Theatre Review

The Clerk reported the Film Theatre review has been received and will be circulated this coming week with an invitation for Councillors to meet and discuss the findings in detail.

c) Assets Committee – Notes of Meeting held 6 March 2025

Councillors noted the previously circulated notes.

233. Open Spaces Committee

a) Notes of Note Change of Next Open Spaces Meeting from 15 April to 29 April 2025

Councillors noted the change of date.

b) Stocks Fair Update

The Deputy Clerk and Councillor, Cooper met with Chloe Stocks to review the Site Plans, Event Management Plan, Safety Certificates, and other related documents. Stocks' annual insurance policy expires in mid-May, and a new insurance certificate will be required before the event. The Clerk acknowledged thanks to Chloe Stocks for her cooperation this year. It was proposed by Councillor Swift, seconded by Councillor Crisp, and agreed that the event application be conditionally approved, pending all necessary paperwork being submitted by the end of May. Councillor Crisp raised a question regarding Stocks' training programme. The Clerk will ask the Deputy Clerk to follow up.

234. Finance

a) Accounts paid March 2025 and Month 12 Income and Expenditure Report

It was proposed by Councillor Motion, seconded by Councillor Last, and agreed to approve the February accounts, along with the monthly income and expenditure sheets from Rialtas. It was noted that these accounts are unreconciled, with the Month 12 accounts remaining open until the full year-end closure, scheduled for 25 April 2025.

b) Notes of Finance Meeting held 03 April 2025

Parochial Charities – The recommendation from Finance was to appoint the Town Council as a Trustees of the Parochial Charities. It has since been confirmed this is not possible therefore a resolution is ongoing. Current Trustees are Councillor's Last, Hill and Cooper.

c) Grant Applications

East Suffolk Transport Association (ESTA)

Councillors noted the grant application from ESTA to update and reprint their Saxmundham to the Coast leaflet. It was proposed by Councillor Motion, seconded by Councillor Last and agreed to grant £100.

Leiston Surgery Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Councillors noted the grant application from Leiston Surgery PPG requesting £2158.80 to purchase an additional portable ECG machine for Leiston Surgery. On recommendation from the Finance Working Group it was proposed by Councillor Crisp, seconded by Councillor Last and agreed to grant £2158.80.

Leiston Book Festival

Councillors noted the grant application from Leiston Book Festival asking for waiver of Leiston Film Theatre Hire charge for Leiston Book Festival to be held 20 September 2025 and requesting for a letter of support from the Town Council to support their application to Sizewell C Project Community Fund, to be submitted in April. After much discussion it was proposed by Councillor Crisp, seconded by Councillor Last and agreed

(7 for, 1 against) to grant £175 towards Leiston Film Theatre Hire costs and offer a letter of support for their Sizewell C Project Community Fund application.

Council noted the need to reflect staffing costs in their Fees and Charges for 2025-2026.

d) Reserves Policy

On recommendation from the Finance Working Group it was proposed by Councillor Corbett, seconded by Councillor Trimmer and agreed the Reserves Policy be approved.

e) Insurance Schedule 2025/26

Following a recommendation from the Finance Working Group, it was proposed by Councillor Corbett, seconded by Councillor Motion, and agreed to approve the 2025/26 Insurance Schedule at a cost of £11,322.40.

235. Infrastructure Working Groups

a) Energy and Infrastructure Working Group - Notes of Meeting held 19 March 2025

Councillors noted the previously circulated report.

b) Sizewell C

Councillor Corbett reported:

Sizewell C Project Biannual Community Forum, 27 March at High Lodge, Darsham.

Councillors Nicky Corbett (representing Council), Lesley Hill, Selena Levermore and Paul Motion attended.

Presentations included a project update and the latest fly through from the project delivery team; an artist's impression of the campus and amenities site; explanation of land take, replanting and biodiversity net gain from Steve Mannings and Luke Stephens; and Alexander Bliss from Cotswold Archaeology on the discovery of the coin hoard, now known as the Cornish pasty due to the shape of the lead covering. Chief executive, Julia Pyke explained the process of funding the project and the lead up to a final investment decision by the government in June.

The campus amenity building is styled on 'a Suffolk barn' (a modern steel and wooden-clad structure rather than a traditional barn). It will house a number of amenities including restaurant, bars and gym, and be big enough for conference style events. The design has a balcony on one end and a mezzanine level inside. The location is to the east of the Eastbridge Road on the left as you enter the site and campus accommodation is to the northeast of the 'barn'. Artist's drawings are on the slide deck available from the forum and will be circulated to councillors once published.

Questions from the floor were dominated by a discussion on local rental prices and availability of affordable housing for local people and visitors. Sizewell C Project countered the argument by saying this is an early trend while the market is tested, and

once other accommodation is in place it will calm down and landlords and agents will find out that extortionate rents are not sustainable. Despite reassurances from Sizewell C Project there were delegates doing the maths who remain convinced that a household of contractors can afford to jointly rent a property for far more than a family or couple. One delegate was looking up rental prices in Leiston on Rightmove during the meeting. Councillor Corbett informed the meeting that Leiston Town Council has had this issue on their agenda at their regular Sizewell C Project meetings for some time and will continue to monitor carefully. No doubt the debate will continue.

Also from the floor was a challenge on the funding model. There is a realisation that with EDF only currently holding a 16% stake, the remaining funding will come from government if private investors are not forthcoming, hence it is at present, the taxpayer bankrolling the project benefits from Sizewell C Project as well as the construction. In the last week, a further £2.7bn has been issued from the government bringing their contribution to date to over £6bn. There was some frustration on both sides and the discussion will continue as we await a final investment decision, which is expected on 11 June.

Sizewell C Project Quarterly Main Development Site Forum 2 April at the LTAA

Councillors Nicky Corbett (representing Council) and Lesley Hill and Helen Greengrass (Councillor Hill left at 7.30pm to attend the TA presentation evening)

The agenda was similar to the Community Forum with the addition of rail and road updates from Sizewell C Project and a presentation on the Health and Wellbeing provision on site.

It is fair to say the disruption will be significant in 25/26 and Sizewell C Project made no excuses for this. The preparation for rail and road improvements to enable less disruption to transport links at peak construction will be intense and logistically difficult. Emphasis for rail this year is on delivering an improved rail line from Ipswich to the Halt in Sizewell Road ahead of the construction of the green rail route which will divert trains away from Leiston in due course and will be constructed over the next two years. Continuous, welded track will replace the existing track throughout. Councillor Corbett challenged Stephen Keighley, representing Sizewell C Project, on the reasoning behind the drastic defoliation behind homes in Carr Avenue and Buller Road, rendering properties less secure. SK explained that this was necessary to allow ample room for materials and workforce, but Councillor Corbett countered this statement by stating that neighbouring properties had not been informed prior to the work and had been shocked by the extent. [Following the meeting, SK asked Councillor Corbett how she felt they could do better with the communication to residents, and she said it would be debated, and we would let him know.] Councillor Corbett also asked Sizewell C Project to reconsider their Noise Mitigation Scheme to include Carr Avenue and Buller Road properties as they were far closer to the track than other homes that have already been included (eg south end of Abbey Road). LTC will keep this on the Sizewell C Project agenda. The railway crossing in Leiston will need to be closed for upgrade work (ie automatic barriers and lights) at some stage later this year, but Sizewell C Project are unable to give details at present. An extra compound on Harrow Lane has been agreed with East Suffolk Council to alleviate the disruption on Buckleswood Road. Positioning

the compound so close to properties was always a concern for us and it demonstrates that Sizewell C Project are listening to the community and acting when they can. Residents have been informed, and it is hoped they are pleased with this development.

We remain disappointed that the Leiston Traffic and Transport Scheme is not on the project delivery timeline. It will be at the earliest, Q1 2026 before we will see any work started.

The presentation on health provision on site was enlightening. It gave reassurance that Leiston Surgery and pharmacy will not be negatively impacted by Sizewell C Project and that services on site could in fact complement Leiston's current provision. The intention is for a minor injury unit to include X Ray and ultrasound scanner to avoid unnecessary trips to A&E and there will be a full time GP and nurses on site, as well as a pharmacy. Apprenticeships in healthcare will also be available. Full details are on the slide deck which will be on the Sizewell C Project site in due course and a link will be sent to Councillors.

Open floor questions: Councillor Corbett had pre submitted the following question:

'HMOs: We are seeing an increasing amount of family homes purchased and converted into HMOs with even reception rooms being turned into bedrooms. Contractors often arrive at their lodgings before many residents are home from work and residents are being forced to park several streets away or use the car park. Narrow residential streets mean even unloading a weekly shop becomes a problem. The size of two contractor vehicles takes up at least three car spaces. This is causing anxiety for many of our residents.

- a) How can the project assist local councils with monitoring occupancy of private lets to ensure the required HMO license has been obtained and
- b) How can you assist with ensuring vehicles are parked in public car parks (free after 6pm) to prevent using residents' parking spaces? (For example, by providing car park season tickets for contractors living in Leiston with no off-street parking'

Richard Bull from Sizewell C Project responded by saying that they are working closely with the Housing Team at East Suffolk Council to monitor the situation. Sizewell C Project are encouraging prospective landlords to use the accommodation register to ensure standards are met. He said the provision of car park permits was 'a good challenge' and they are actively looking into ways of alleviating the parking issue. Again, we will keep this on the agenda as a rolling item.

A question had also been submitted about air quality monitoring in Leiston town centre and around the main site perimeter. We were advised that this question could not be raised at the meeting as it is an East Suffolk Council responsibility. However, Councillor Corbett has received a response from Sizewell C Project since the meeting and will circulate to councillors.

Other energy projects

Sealink: Council will send a statement to the planning inspectorate in respect of Sealink as the examination period is now open. It will be based on the statement we sent during

the consultation process where we objected on the grounds of the cumulative impact of the many energy projects. Please send any further thoughts you might have to the Clerk by Thursday 10th.

East Suffolk Communities Energy Partnership (East Suffolk Council EP) meeting at Snape - Thursday 10th

There is a meeting of East Suffolk Council EP parishes on Thursday 10 April at the Britten Studio, Snape Maltings. All 52 parishes in East Suffolk have been invited to join.

The venue is being provided free of charge. The agenda and invite have been circulated by the Clerk (on 24 March), so please let us know if you intend to participate. There will be a workshop opportunity to discuss how to show a united front under the pressure of the numerous energy projects planned for this coastline. While we understand parishes might have differing opinions in some areas, there is a common belief that it is too much for our area. We are hoping the MP will be able to attend, as well as our district and county representatives. Ultimately, we hope to directly engage the Dept. for Energy Security and Net Zero in further discussion, but this is proving difficult with the present government.

"Nuclear Communities and Mayors in Focus" Vienna, May 2025

Leiston-cum-Sizewell Mayor, Lesley Hill, has been invited to join this event by the International Atomic Energy Agency. Councillor Hill has contacted the organisers, and they have agreed to receive a statement from Council which will summarise how being host to the nuclear industry for 60 years has impacted both positively and negatively on our community. Councillors will be circulated the draft in advance. Please contact Councillor Corbett if you have any observations you would like to add to the statement.

c) Traffic and Transport Working Group

Councillors will have the opportunity to view the town centre improvement plans and send comments to the working group at a specially convened meeting with Sizewell C Project on 23 April - an invite has already been circulated. The next full meeting of the group is in late June.

Representatives from the council and other parishes have been asked to join a discussion on permanent traffic monitoring devices to be located in the local area and this will be discussed with council in due course.

Cycle Route 8 (Red House Lane to King Georges Avenue) – The Mayor, Councillors Levermore and Last, along with the Clerk, took part in a walk of the route on 21 March to view the completed works to date and to view the planned path.

d) Neighbourhood Plan Review Steering Group, Notes of Meeting 25 March 2025

The notes of this meeting will be circulated in due course. Councillor Last confirmed a date for the public engagement event, Saturday 28 June 2025.

e) Sizewell A and B Stakeholder Meeting 25 March 2025

Councillor Hill provided a brief verbal report on this meeting the minutes of which be circulated when available.

f) Sizewell Residents meeting held 31 March 2025

Councillor Motion attended the Sizewell Residents Meeting held 31 March 2025 and reported that the focus of the meeting was environmental issues. Luke Stevens, Land Management Lead, Sizewell C Project shared a PowerPoint presentation. The next meeting scheduled for 19 May will focus on HGV's and traffic management.

Following the resignation of Councillor Wray, a new Town Council representative is needed for Net Zero Leiston. With a relaunch expected and significant progress anticipated in the coming year, it is important that the Town Council remains actively involved. f) Leiston Library

Councillors noted the previously circulated report that included the letter from Stuart Keeble, Director of Public Health and Communities, Suffolk County Council (SCC) confirming that Suffolk Libraries are back in house under SCC. The report also highlights concerns from Friends Groups about how Friends Group will work within the new structure. Councillors are reminded we currently act as treasurer to the Friends of Leiston Library.

Councillors acknowledged the letter from Young People Taking Action (CYDS), expressing gratitude to the Town Council for their financial support and prompt assistance during a time of financial crisis.
